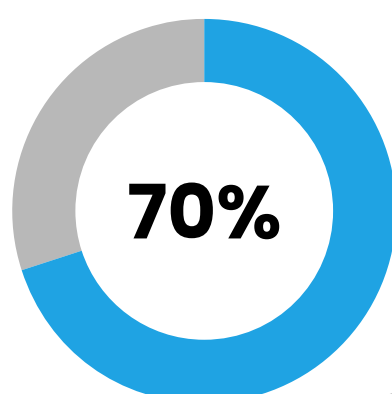
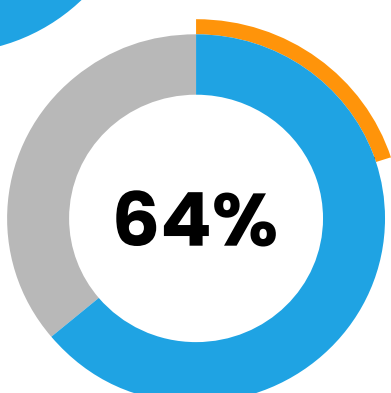


The State of Collaboration – It’s in Crisis!

70% agree that poor collaboration is limiting their productivity and wasting their time.

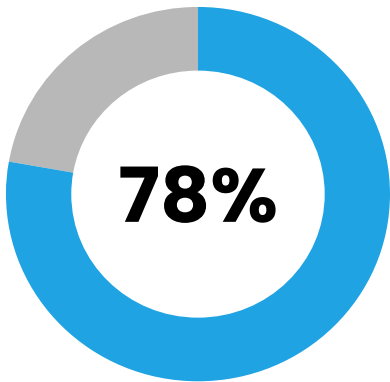
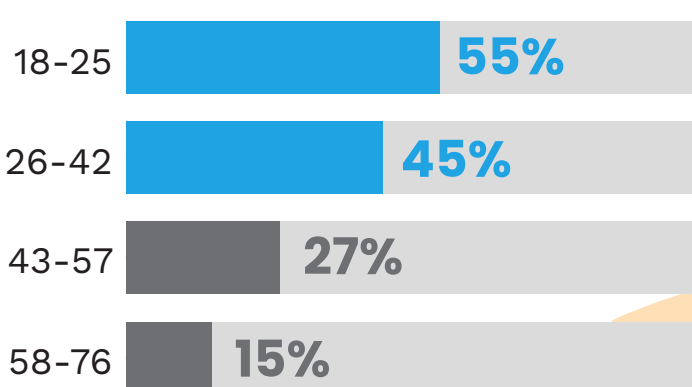


64% are wasting a minimum of 3 hours per week, with **20%** wasting as many as 6 hours weekly.

Collaboration is so poor that **41% of employees are considering leaving their job as a result.**

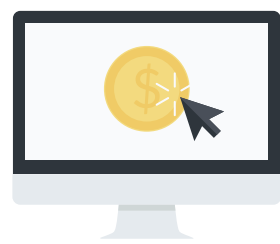


Gen Zs and Millennials are the age groups most likely to quit their job because of poor collaboration tools.

25% say that their organizations’ collaboration tools have poor functionality.

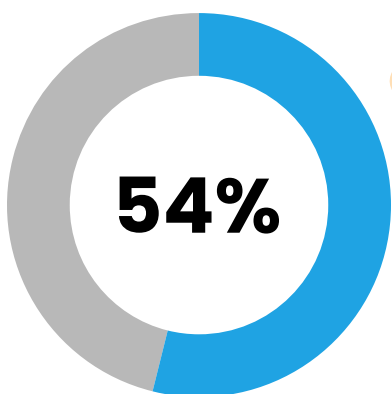


22% aren’t using the tools at their disposal.

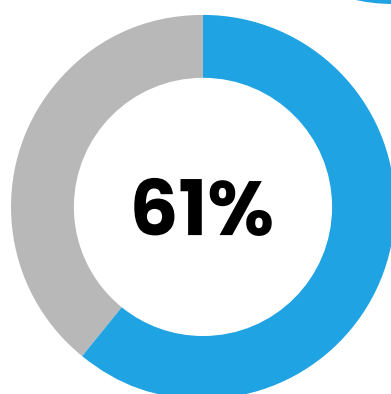


21% haven’t been trained on their organizations’ collaboration tools.
